Math

Over the past two weeks we honed our compass skills and use them to create congruent lines, angles, angle bisectors, perpendicular bisectors and congruent triangles. language" around this unit is more specific and it has been great to hear students using words like, "congruent, co-interior angles, supplementary angles, line segments, corresponding angles, and transversals." Students are doing a great job helping each other in their desk groups to ensure that everyone understands the concepts as I work my way around the room to check in and give assistance. Geometry Quiz 1 was completed online. Looking ahead... we will start our week with our postponed Geo Quiz 2 (paper and pencil). On Tuesday we will revisit long division and multiplication (2 digits by 3 digits) so that we keep our computation skills sharpe! We will move on to our next unit on fractions.

We also started our writing unit which focuses on the 4 writing elements on the grade 10 Provincial Literacy Test (informational paragraph, summary, opinion piece and News Report). I know this is only grade 7, but I feel strongly that if students are exposed to and have opportunities for practice then they will be more selfconfident and stronger writers. Looking ahead... we will start back with TUSC on March 4th. Students will continue to have some time during the week to read for their "Read, Relax & Repeat" reading assignment. We will finish up our information paragraph and peer edit (in pairs) one or two other paragraphs.
